Conditions of Entry

2019 Key Awards Dates

Submissions open 1 January 2019

Final submission due 8 April 2019

Finalists Announced – up to four in each category 19 June 2019

Awards ceremony – all winners announced 14 September 2019

Eligibility criteria

- 1. Entrants must be of New Zealand Māori descent.
- 2. Each award category is open to adults and school students.
- 3. The **First-time Writer** award is for writers who have never had their writing published, either online or in hard copy format (excluding in a school magazine, on your own blog or your own website).
- 4. The **Emerging Writer** award is for writers who have had an essay, article or a short story published, either online or in hard copy format.
- 5. The **Published Writer** award is for writers who have had their own book published.

Categories

- First-time Writer in te reo Māori
- First-time Writer in English
- Emerging Writer in te reo Māori
- Emerging Writer in English
- Published Writer in te reo Māori
- Published Writer in English

Submission Guidelines

- 1. Entries must be original, your own work, not previously published or under contract, and no longer than 3000 words. It can be fiction or non-fiction.
- 2. Entries may be written in te reo Māori or English.

- 3. All entries must be submitted by individuals. There is no limit to the number of entries an individual may submit. However, each new submission must be uploaded separately with a new entry form.
- 4. All entries **MUST** be submitted online at <u>www.mlt.org.nz</u> as follows:
 - Title of the short story and category at the top of each page of the entry
 - Typed in point size 12 or more with double line spaces, and each page should be numbered
 - Saved as a .docx or .pdf file

<u>Do not include your name on your work; all entries are judged 'blind', i.e., anonymously.</u>
<u>Your name should only be on the entry form.</u>

- 5. Entries must be received by **11:59 p.m. on Monday, 8 April 2019**. Entries received after this closing date will not be eligible.
- 6. Entries will be acknowledged as received but not returned.
- 7. Huia Publishers' staff, the sponsors (including their staff members), the judges, and their immediate families are not eligible to enter.

Prizes

- The winner of each category will receive a \$2000 cash prize each. Two highly commended finalists in each category will receive a cash prize of \$500 each.
- Selected winners and finalists will also be published in *Huia Short Stories 13* the
 contemporary fiction series published by Huia Publishers. Huia Publishers reserves the right
 to publish these entries without additional payment to the authors.

Judging

- The judges' decisions are final, and no correspondence will be entered into.
- Finalists will be announced on Wednesday, 19 June 2019 on the Trust website and in a media release.

The Awards Ceremony

- Winners will be announced on Saturday, 14 September at the awards ceremony in Wellington.
- Winners must be prepared to attend the awards ceremony and be involved in promotional activities as reasonably requested by the organisers.
